Invitation to an Open Forum: Psychosocial Response to Disasters with Focus on Children in Asia

The Asian Disaster Preparedness Center (ADPC) with support from the Norwegian Ministry of Foreign Affairs is hosting an **Open Forum on Psychosocial Response to Disasters with Focus on Children in Asia**. The Open Forum will be held at Imperial Queen's Park Hotel, Bangkok, Thailand on **26 January 2010** from **9:00 am-4:00 pm**.

The Open Forum will explore this vital issue through keynote presentations, case studies and debate. It will bring together representatives from Ministries of Health, Non-Governmental Agencies, National Red Cross/Red Crescent Societies from Bangladesh, China, Indonesia, Nepal, Philippines, Sri Lanka, Thailand and Vietnam, UN and donor agencies, academic institutions and media representatives.

Participants will have the opportunity to share and learn from experiences in the management of psychosocial responses to disasters and emergencies in children. The event will identify challenges and gaps in capacity to deal with child psychosocial issues, resulting from disasters and emergencies in Asia.

The Open Forum is part of ADPC's wider initiative on Psychosocial Response to Disasters, with funding support from the Norwegian Ministry of Foreign Affairs. The project will strengthen national capacity throughout Asia, to manage the psychosocial aspects of disasters and emergencies.
