Essential 1 – Risk reducing organization and coordination in place

Status - 2

Progress and achievements – Many initiatives have been taken to increase safety in school buildings and public places. The Emergency Intervention plan is being written with provisions for infrastructures and settings that will allow it to be operative

Plans – Once operative the program will be checked in many drills that will be also opportunity for citizen participation and awareness improvement

Essential 2 – Budget assigned

Status - 3

Progress and achievements – After extensive and through survey of urban buildings reconstruction according to the highest norms of safety has been realized according to priorities of danger and value of the building

Plans – Continue reconstruction according to priorities of public and private safety.

Essential 3 – Risk assessment prepared

Status - 3

Progress and achievements – Hydro-geologic risk has been evaluated and mapped by the Sele River Basin Authority; Seismic risk is mapped by Regional and National authorities. Construction is not being allowed any longer where risk is high according to any of the two maps.

Plans – Land interventions will be planned with special attention to wild-fire crossing routes and hydro-geologic vulnerability.

Essential 4 – Investment in risk reducing infrastructure

Status - 3

Progress and achievements – Resources made available by the regional, provincial and municipal authorities allowed consolidation around hydro-geologically fragile areas and instable ground (main church in the urban area and other town districts). Special consolidation works have allowed restoration and consolidation of important buildings and upgrade of areas of highest and high hydro-geological risk to second and first lowest grade (on a scale of VL, L, H, YH).

Plans – Consolidation against hydro-geological risk still requires large scale interventions for land consolidation and punctual interventions on highly dangerous situations and buildings of public and historical value

Essential 5 – Safe schools and health facilities

Status - 3

Progress and achievements – All school buildings have been evaluated for their vulnerability.

<p>Work on two of them allowed upgrade to norm, while two were completely or almost completely demolished and built according to norm. Building after demolition of a third school building is in progress.</p>	
<p>Plans – One other intervention is scheduled on one other school building. No hospital is on our territory. The health and treatment center that serves locally will soon be moved to a newly built site.</p>	
<p>Essential 6 – Risk-compliant building regulation and land use applied</p>	<p>Status - 3</p>
<p>Progress and achievements – Norms intended to increase safety and remove situation of risk have been applied in recent years with great progress in land, infrastructure and building safety.</p>	
<p>Plans – Our main effort aims at the construction business to increase awareness about best building practices according to safety and energy saving norms</p>	
<p>Essential 7 – Education programmes and training in place</p>	<p>Status - 2</p>
<p>Progress and achievements – Safety culture is becoming ingrained in our mind set. We are aware that our land is naturally at risk but good practice, risk prevention and preparedness can greatly improve our capacity to save lives and infrastructures.</p>	
<p>Plans – We do not have yet a well organized and coordinated system of response to emergencies and disaster. We wish to direct our efforts toward the organization of such an intervention/response system and toward regular drills that will allow to increase citizen awareness</p>	
<p>Essential 8 – Ecosystems and natural buffers protected</p>	<p>Status - 2</p>
<p>Progress and achievements – Many parts of the municipal territory are of natural and/or historical value and deserve protection.</p>	
<p>Plans – Three planned National park of the Vulture will include some of areas of our territory. Locally we must increase surveillance and intervention efficiency against wild fires</p>	
<p>Essential 9 – Early warning systems installed</p>	<p>Status - 2</p>
<p>Progress and achievements – Different research institutions and agencies monitor seismic and hydro-geological risk and alerts are transmitted to local authorities through the office of the Prefettura</p>	
<p>Plans – We wish to establish a strong organization of volunteers that can intervene in case of danger.</p>	
<p>Essential 10 – Needs-based (survivors) reconstruction</p>	<p>Status - 3</p>
<p>Progress and achievements – Reconstruction was realized with the idea of improving resilience and preparedness</p>
