In the above context, I highly recommend Asian Disaster Preparedness Center (ADPC), Thailand for the prestigious 2015 Sasakawa Award.



In less than 400 words, please describe the remarkable and innovative effort carried out by the nominee to reduce the impact of disasters and build disaster resilience under the theme "Shaping the Future."

I wish to acknowledge the vital role being played by ADPC through policy interventions, capacity building, early warning system development and sector based mainstreaming for "Shaping the Future of disaster risk reduction (DRR) in Sri Lanka".

After the devastating Indian Ocean Tsunami in December 2004, our government worked relentlessly to establish an institutional structure and coordination mechanism for DRR in the country. ADPC has made great contributions through technical assistance for establishment of the Disaster Management Center (2005) and subsequent interventions for institutional development of the Ministry of Disaster Management. Furthermore, ADPC has provided valuable strategic contributions for developing "Roadmap for Disaster Management towards Safer Sri Lanka" in 2005 and introducing guidelines for safer construction after witnessing the Tsunami devastation to the housing sector.

ADPC is well recognized in the region for its expertise in capacity building in DRR themes, which are selectively tailored to meet the expectations and needs of the target countries. Disaster Resilience Leadership course initiated in Sri Lanka since 2011, stands out as an innovative intervention, which addresses the leadership gaps for strengthening disaster resilience. This course has brought together multi-stakeholder practitioners from different ranks of hierarchy, ranging from senior to middle management.

ADPC has promoted the utilization of science-based information to deal with potential extreme events through capacity enhancement of the Department of Meteorology. This has considerably improved the reliability of weather forecasts and timely dissemination of early warning to communities at risk. In addition, ADPC has assisted local governments in Eastern Sri Lanka in empowering communities to respond to early warning effectively and improving preparedness capacity, which is a good replicable model elsewhere.

MunichRE RISK Award 2014 has chosen ADPC initiated project on "Mainstreaming climate information application for enhancement of ecosystems functions for DRR", as one of the best projects. This project aims at enhancing the resilience of vulnerable farming communities in Nilwala river basin, introducing an innovative system by technology integration for Climate Change Adaptation.

ADPC recognizes the need for highly talented professionals representing different disciplines for countrywide development. ADPC has achieved this objective by extending dedicated support to the Postgraduate Institute of Science in University of Peradeniya in helping to institutionalize a Masters Degree course in Disaster Management. This competitive postgraduate course is contributing towards creating skilled local professionals in DRR, who have the potential for shaping the future of Sri Lanka by contributing through safer development practices.

Currently ADPC program administration, resource mobilization and institutional management are being carried out as per institutional policies of the Foundation. ADPC has significantly expanded its resource base and programs over the last 28 years. To date ADPC has around 100 professional staff employed in Bangkok office and country offices. The main income sources of ADPC is through bi-lateral cooperation with several donor countries and other income is generated through conduct of regular regional level capacity building programs, training and consultancy services. Given ADPC's established professional standing, its growing viability with diversified support, ADPC has demonstrated its capacity to harness and mobilize financial resources in a sustainable manner.
