Outline of content:	 The session discussed the development of a strategy and action plan on Hazard Risk Management for the South Asia Region based on the following objectives: Enhancing the understanding of the Region's vulnerability and potential economic and social impacts of the disasters Developing a framework to systematically upgrade SAR countries' capacities to manage hazard risks Preparing a resource and time bound action plan for high priority risk mitigation investment programs Facilitating cooperation between countries on critical issues of regional importance

Recommendations for the ISDR system (list 2 or 3 items):	 Representatives from South Asian countries endorsed the need for the strategy and concurred on the following next steps: A detailed concept note and preparation schedule should be drafted by the World Bank and further discussed during the up-coming 2nd Asian Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction in November in New Delhi The note should include the approach and time line for i) carrying out country risk profiles; ii) development of country specific high priority risk mitigation action plan (resource and time bound); iii) consultation process; iv) identification of regional priorities and capacity strengthening initiatives; iv) benchmarking, monitoring and up-dating on implementation of mitigation measures World Bank and UNISDR will facilitate the preparation and implementation of the SAR Hazard Risk Management Strategy jointly with national Governments and international partners
