- Between 2000-2008 ECOWAS countries all together experienced 89 flood (source OFDA-CRED /Université de Louvain)

# A Regional Study such as

 ✓ identifying transnational spill-over causes/effects/impacts of floods from a number of different points of view: meteorological, hydro-geological, economical, transport, trade, migration, etc.

 ✓ identifying opportunities and modalities for enhanced regional cooperation on Disaster Risk Reduction, Preparedness and Early Warning Systems.

 ✓ take into account existing regional cooperation mechanisms in West-Africa, of which an important example are basin organizations/organisations pour la mise en valeur.
