





Fire tenders cannot enter lanes in areas such as Laxmisagar, Old Town and Shastri Nagar as they are too narrow. Many new housing colonies in Bhimpur, Shastri Nagar, Soubhagya Nagar (Phase I and II), lower Baramunda village, Friends Colony, Biveb Estate and Ratna Villa, too, face the same problem of narrow lanes

BMC is training masons on technologies required
