Montreal, Canada, 29-31 May 2012

Dear Sir/Madam,

1 ITU together with Industry Canada is organizing the Seventh Symposium on ICTs, the Environment and Climate Change, hosted by Prompt. The Symposium will be held from 29 to 31 May 2012 at the headquarters of International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO), Montreal, Canada. This is the seventh Symposium on climate change following successful events held between 2008 and 2011 in Kyoto, London, Quito, Seoul, Cairo and Accra.

The Symposium will open at 0930 hours on the first day. Participants' registration will begin at 0830 hours. Detailed information concerning the meeting room will be provided at the entrance of the meeting venue.

- 2 Discussions will be held in English. Interpretation will be provided in French.
- The main purpose of the event is to move forward the agenda on using ICTs to monitor climate change, mitigate and adapt to its effects and, in this light, identify future requirements for ITU's related work including standardization of ICT equipment and networks as well as development activities (see Resolution 73 of the 2008 World Telecommunication Standardization Assembly (WTSA-08), Resolution 66 of the 2010 World Telecommunication Development Conference (WTDC-10) and Resolution 182 of the 2010 Plenipotentiary Conference (PP-10)).

The Symposium in Montreal will focus on the issue of ICTs, the environment and climate change in the world and the needs for smart green ICT technologies. Topics to be discussed will include mitigation and adaptation to climate change, e-waste, disaster preparedness, cost-effective ICT technologies, methodologies for the environmental impact assessment of ICTs, challenges and opportunities in the transition to a green and resource efficient economy.

The Symposium will identify possible goals, commitments and modalities of ICT sector commitments to be developed in the process leading to the forthcoming ITU's World Telecommunication Standardization

assembly (WTSA) and the United Nations Conference on Sustainable Development (UNCSD 2012 or Rio+20), strengthening at the same time the collaboration between the ICT and environmental communities.

- 4 The Symposium will bring together leading specialists in the field, from top policy-makers to engineers, designers, planners, government officials, regulators, standards experts and others.
- Participation is open to ITU Member States, Sector Members, Associates and Academic Institutions and to any individual from a country which is a member of ITU who wishes to contribute to the work. This includes individuals who are also members of international, regional and national organizations.
- A preliminary draft programme is set out in **Annex 1**. The updated programme, presentations and relevant information will be made available on the ITU-T website at the following address: http://www.itu.int/ITU-T/worksem/climatechange/201205/programme.html and will be kept updated as necessary.

- Fellowships: ITU-T will provide a limited number of full fellowships to one participant per eligible country and within the available budget. The participant must be duly authorized by the respective ITU Administrations from Least Developed Countries and from developing countries with per-capita income under US\$ 2,000. While the provision of fellowship is limited to only one participant per country, the number of delegates from a country is not limited provided the expenses of additional delegates are borne by the country. Participants requiring a fellowship are requested to complete the Fellowship Request Form in Annex 3 and return it to the ITU by e-mail: bdtfellowships@itu.int or by fax to +41 22 730 5778 by 27 April 2012 at the latest.

3. TRANSPORTATION

Montreal's public local transport is served by a network of buses, subways, and commuter trains that extend across and off the island. The subway and bus system is operated by the Société de transport de Montréal (STM). The Metro (http://www.stm.info/English/metro/a-mapmet.htm) has 68 stations spread out along its four lines, while the bus network consists of 197 daytime and 20 night time service routes that provide a vast number of routes for the city of Montreal proper. It also provides adapted transport and wheelchair-accessible buses.

5. PRACTICAL INFORMATION

✓ About the country

Canada is a North American country consisting of ten provinces and three territories. Located in the northern part of the continent, it extends from the Atlantic Ocean in the east to the Pacific Ocean in the west, and northward into the Arctic Ocean. Spanning over 9.9 million square kilometres, Canada is the world's second-largest country by total area, and its common border with the United States is the longest land border in the world.

Canada is a federal state that is governed as a parliamentary democracy and a constitutional monarchy with Queen Elizabeth II as its head of state. It is a bilingual nation with both English and French as official languages at the federal level. One of the world's most highly-developed countries, Canada has a diversified economy that is reliant upon its abundant natural resources and upon trade – particularly with the United States, with which Canada has had a long and complex relationship. It is a member of the G7, G8, G20,NATO, OECD, WTO, Commonwealth of Nations, Francophonie, OAS, APEC, and UN. With the sixth-highest Human Development Indexglobally, Canada has one of the highest standards of living in the world.

✓ Time zone

The time zone in Montreal is GMT – 04:00.

✓ Weather

The weather in Montréal varies from -8.9°C (16°F) to 22.3°C (72.1°F) depending on the season, so visitors are encouraged to check the forecast before packing.

Below are average monthly temperatures and some Web site links that provide basic weather information to help you plan your visit

- May 14.5°C (58.1°F)
- June 19.3°C (66.7°F)

✓ Electricity

Canadian appliances operate on 110 volts (60 Hz), which is identical to the US voltage. A universal adaptor is required for overseas electrical devices.

Main wall sockets (or power outlets) and plugs for 110 volts are two parallel flat blades. If those sockets are different from the ones used in your country you will need a socket converter.

√ Vaccination requirements

No special immunizations or vaccinations are required to visit Canada. If you're travelling with children, it's always a good idea to ensure they are up-to-date on routine childhood immunizations before international travel.
