DRR IN UK

 Something serious has to happen before the real action is taken

Turning point in 2005 when the CCA became into force

Legislative framework for DRR

CCA

- Clear obligations to the local level
- Clear vision of the risks (flooding, drought, pandemic flu, space weather, extreme weather conditions e.g. winter)
- Over 40 regions or local areas where so called local resilience forums (LRF) had to be organised according the CCA
- In the LRF all the necessary stakeholders are represented
- The minumum level of service is not defined but the government rather tries to persuade different organisations to take necessary arrangements

GOOD PRACTICES

- A chief scientist system
- Natural hazard partnership
- Flood forecasting centre where hydrology and meteorology has been unified
- Business continuity planning
 - Business countinuity for dummies
- Lincolnshire at the local level, where 7 counties (regions) were co-operationg in terms of risks

OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

- The UK administrative system (England, Wales, Scotland, Northern Ireland)
 - In Scotland however the emergency services is going to be unified (now 7 regions, in the future 1)
 - Decentralisation of the environment agency (now one taking care of Wales and England, in the future the Welsh government will have their own agency)
- Engage volunteer organisations to the DRR work more closely
