Occurrence and Challenges of Disasters in the IDB Member Countries

- Disasters occurrence in the IDB member countries: from 199 incidences in the 1970s to 1,431 incidences in the 2000-2012.
- IDB Member Countries' share of natural disasters increased from 23% in 1980-99 to 26% in 2000-12.
- Cost of damages: increased from US\$3.0bn the 1970s in to US\$67.0bn in the 1990s; decreasing to US\$65.0bn in 2000-12.
- Severity of impact on low- and middle-income countries.
- Increasing needs to contend with disasters.

Actions To Contend With Disasters

- Developing disaster risks management programs.
- Integrating disaster management into the national development programs.
- Developing appropriate financial mechanisms for disaster management.

- Projects' Financing
- > Strengthening disaster preparedness and sustainable recovery or Post-conflict/disaster Reconstruction
- Reduction of the underlying risk factors: Projects targeted at drought/floods mitigation and addressing factors leading to conflicts over natural resources.

- Capacity building and institutional support technical assistance and non-refundable grants
- Emergency response in terms of quick aid/assistance
- Partnership/Cooperating with development and multilateral institutions to assist member countries in DRM.

- Developing a specific policy framework for disaster-prone member countries. The policy will provide a framework for intervention:
- Developing specific financial products to support proactive/preventive measures and recovery efforts in situations of fragility and crisis affected regions
- Islamic Solidarity Fund for Development as a dedicated IDB arm for poverty reduction

- Enhancing resilience to natural disasters and reducing conflicts over natural resources: The Sustainable Villages Program.
- Supporting Post-Conflict Reconstruction Efforts: Darfur case.
