Their areas of coverage include; climate change, training, M&E, fund management, programme management, observer mission, etc.

#### Joseph Mutsigwa (PhD Candidate, MPhil, BPhil, BA, Dips)

Mr. Mutsigwa is Sustainable Development Specialist with excellent skills, expertise, knowledge and experience in project management for development programmes and projects. He has more than 18 years of cumulative experience of working in the environment, DRR and development sectors in Southern Africa with a particular attention to Climate Change. He has key competencies in institutional capacity strengthening and multi-sectoral programming for development programmes and projects including application of sustainability planning principles in project management. Since 2002, he has been extensively involved in environment, energy, climate change, disaster risk reduction development programmes. He has worked with civil society organizations in Southern Africa, governments, the United Nations and private practice as management and development consultant. He is a member of the International Association for Impact Assessment (IAIA, South Africa). Mr. Mutsigwa holds a master of philosophy (MPhil) degree in Sustainable Development Planning. He is presently pursuing PhD studies in Disaster Management at the University of the Free State (UFS).

### Millan Atam (Phd. Candidate, MM-P&DM, MA, BA)

Mr. Atam has over about 15 years' experience in humanitarian and emergency sector, with a strong background in Strategy and Management. He has been instrumental in developing and reviewing the Contingency Plans, Emergency Operations Management Plans, CERF, Flash Appeals on behalf of Humanitarian Country Teams and is quite at home working within government structures where he has often provided technical support. Over the past few years, he has supported Resident/Humanitarian Coordinators as Humanitarian Advisor over several different countries on the continent. His experience spans various UN agencies, INGOs and DPKO Missions.

Specific to Emergency Preparedness and Response, Mr. Atam has covered M&E, Emergency Fund Management, Programme Management, as well as providing Humanitarian Advise to UN Resident Coordinators. He was the Head of the OCHA Country Team during his last UN mission. He has built a wide network across the African continent and is regularly consulted by various media outlets to contribute to burning issues on the continent. He holds a Masters of Management from the Wits School of Governance and a Masters in Forced Migration Studies.
