# Jamaica's Vulnerability to Disasters

According to the World Bank's Natural Disaster Hotspots Report, Jamaica ranks as the country third most exposed to multiple hazards in the world, with 87.7% of GDP and 87.7% of population in areas at risk from three or more hazards. Over the past 20 years, Jamaica's disasters resulted in cumulative costs of more than US\$1billion. Among the various hazards the country faces, floods and landslides are the most frequently occurring ones in part due to factors relating to topography, geology, and meteorological exposure.

















# Inter –agency collaboration

The National Disaster Management programme requires the support of public and private sector, donor groups, voluntary agencies and NGOs.

- Each disaster has multiple implications for intervention
- Often requires input from National, international agencies

Collaboration needed to save money, through having a coordinated mechanism and reliance on existing resources.

















#### National Disaster Act



- Enacted in 1993
- Disaster Preparedness and Emergency Management Act
- Repealed 2015 (The Disaster Risk Management Act 2015) reflect new thinking and relating to disaster risk reduction in context of sustainable national development
- Intended to provide the legal framework upon which disaster risk reduction and disaster response operations

















## National Disaster Plan



- Developed in 1993
- Revised 1997 reflect up-to-date thinking and technologies relating to disaster management in the wider context of sustainable national development
- Intended to provide the legal framework upon which disaster preparedness, operations and training are predicated


