Context

UN Member States have identified a **need for**:

- Support and implementation of the technical support requirements of the Sendai Framework
- Strengthening of the capacity in DRR

Since July 2017, the UNISDR Global Education and Training Institute (GETI) convened a **series of** regional, online, and one-one **consultations** involving over 200 participants.

The outcome of these consultations and a concurrent literature review is **strategic guidance** crafted to improve the effectiveness of capacity development programs and actions.

















Summary

The **goal** of the strategy is:

a Vision of Risk-Informed Sustainable Development by 2030.

The strategy provides high-level guidance in six areas of need identified:

- 1. Developing and Strengthening DRR Fundamentals
- 2. Institutionalizing DRR Capacity
- 3. Sharing and Using Risk Information Before and After Disasters
- Establishing Collaborative Action for DRR at the National and Local Levels
- 5. Strengthening External Support Mechanisms
- 6. Advancing and Expanding DRR Capabilities

















Recommendations

- **1. Promoting awareness** of the need for capacity development at all levels and by all stakeholders, and supporting the development of national and local strategic plans

- **3. Expanding** South-South, Triangular, and other **partnership and cooperation** opportunities through the creation of a global capacity development provider marketplace
