The following logistical and administrative information pertaining to the event will facilitate your arrival and participation in the meeting.

**A. Venue and Registration:**

The Global Expert consultation will take place on Wednesday 14 and Thursday 15 March 2018 from 9:00 to 17:30 at the Centre International des Conférences de Genève (CICG) in **Rooms 5-6** (revised location) on the 3rd floor. It is recommended to use the elevator. A reception will be held from 17:45 on Day 2, 15 March.

**Registration** will open with welcome coffee, 08:30-09:00 on 14 March.

As we are expecting a large numbers of participants at the registration desk, we advise you to anticipate at least 15 minutes to register for the Meeting.

*NB: Please bring a passport or national ID with you in case of Security control.*

**B. Accommodation:**

Participants are responsible for making arrangements for their own accommodation.

**Important:** All representatives are required to have adequate medical insurance prior to arrival.

**C. Visa:**

Participants are responsible to obtain proper visa (entry/transit) prior to the date of departure.

UNISDR will provide visa support letter if required and upon request.

**D. Working Language:**

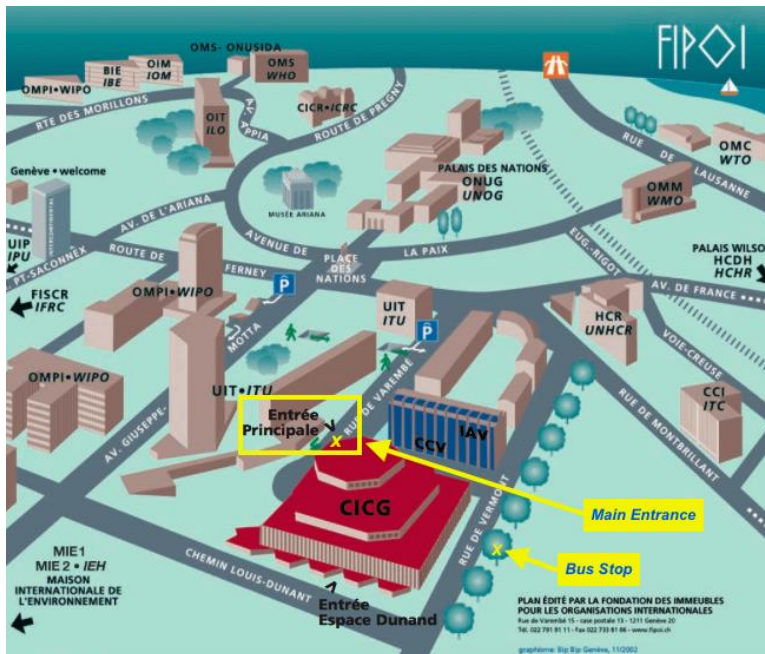
Please note that the working language of the expert consultation is English. Interpretation services will not be provided.

**E. Access:**

Coming to the CICG from the central train station (Gare Cornavin), take the Bus 5 (direction Aéroport) and stop at **Vermont**.

To go from the Airport to the CICG, take the Bus 5 (direction Thonex-Vallard) and stop at **Vermont**.

*Vermont bus stop is facing one lateral side of the CICG*



### Travel free on public transport during your stay in Geneva

With effect from January 2008, **you can pick up a free ticket for public transport** from the machine in the baggage collection area at the Arrival level Cointrin Airport.

This UNIRESO ticket, offered by “Genève Aéroport”, allows you to use public transport in Geneva free for a period of 80 minutes.



When you stay in a hotel, a youth hostel or at a campsite, you receive **free of charge** a Geneva Transport Card. Taking the tram, the bus and the train on Geneva territory, even the yellow taxi-boats is free.

This personal and non-transferable card is offered to you at arrival. During your stay in Geneva, you can use the entire Geneva transport network (UNIRESO: bus and tram (TPG), train (CFF) and taxi-boats (Les Mouettes Genevoises). <http://www.tpg.ch>
