About the Symposium

"The greatness of a nation and its moral progress can be judged by the way its animals are treated."

- Mahatma Gandhi

More than a billion of the world's poorest people rely on animals for their food and incomes; 752 million livestock keepers live on less than \$2 a day. The poor are most vulnerable to disasters – they are often highly exposed to hazards and have less capacity to cope, adapt and recover.

The Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015–2030 represents a major shift in how Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) is conceptualized. Countries now need to incorporate animal protection into DRR policies, plans and activities to reduce economic losses and safeguard livelihoods.

South Asian countries account for a quarter of global population (roughly 1.7 billion), agriculture is the main source of livelihood for 51% of people and 42% of landmass is under agricultural operation. Average modeled physical exposure per year due to floods in South Asia is 44,713,000 affecting 1.7% of the Gross Domestic Product (GDP). Therefore, this needs a regional focus to cooperate and jointly address the issues related to animals in disasters.

Animals are more to their owners than simple commodities. They are productive assets requiring protection and care to preserve their productive quality. They provide livelihoods, cultural identity and companionship. But implementing Sendai doesn't stop with policy. This is why we as veterinary professionals need to take active measures to foster a culture of disaster preparedness starting with empowering the veterinary institutions.

Symposium Themes

- Theme 1 will focus on disaster's impact on animals and livelihood of vulnerable communities and the existing gaps and challenges
- Theme 2 will highlight the opportunities and the scope for veterinary institutions could play in protecting animals from disasters

- Theme 3 will focus on the role on sharing of experiences and best practices of veterinary institutions during disasters

- Theme 4 will identify and address the constraints existing within the academic and institutional framework.

In the closing session, a summary of agreed recommendations will be presented on collaboration and commitments towards furthering achievement of the Sendai Framework, The Paris Agreement on Climate Change and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG).

TANUVAS at a glance
