



REGIONAL CONSULTATIVE WORKSHOP ON DISASTER RISK REDUCTION STRATEGIES

Attaining the Sendai Framework Target 'E' on National and Local DRR Strategies

13-14 December 2018 - UNCC Bangkok, Thailand

Background

The Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015–2030 ushered in a paradigm shift from managing disasters to managing disaster risk, and solidified the role of Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) in the fulfilment of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

Achieving the goals of risk prevention, risk reduction, and resilience-building requires a strategic approach that is led by the national government but includes all stakeholders. To reflect the urgency of developing these plans, Target 'e' of the Sendai Framework sets a deadline of 2020 for countries to have their national and local disaster risk reduction strategies.

Leaders in the Asia-Pacific region affirmed their commitment to this target in the 2016 Asia Regional Plan for Implementation of the Sendai Framework¹, and again at the 2018 Asian Ministerial Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction, in Mongolia².

To help countries meet this target ahead of the year 2020, UNSIDR is organizing this regional workshop to promote knowledge sharing and the exchange of good practices and lessons learned among member states on how they are developing and implementing national and local strategies.

Objectives and Expected Outcomes

Nationally developed and adopted DRR strategies should provide a clear vision,

guide the development of action plans, enable participation of all concerned stakeholders and enhance coordination within and across sectors.

The consultative workshop, being organized following the ISDR-Asia Partnership (IAP) Forum³, will focus on building a common understanding of how countries and sub-national governments can develop DRR strategies that enable them to achieve the goals of the Sendai Framework.

With this view, the workshop will:

- Take stock of the status in the region in developing and implementing DRR strategies at the national and local level.
- Share good practices and lessons learned on developing, financing and implementing DRR strategies at all levels.
- Identify best approaches to create the enabling environment required for adopting inclusive, comprehensive and actionable DRR strategies which strengthen coherence with sustainable development and climate change policies.
- Identify country needs and explore potential support, including through promoting partnerships.

The workshop will result in:

• Better understanding of how DRR strategies can be developed and

leveraged as policy tools to manage disaster risk.

- Understanding of how to align DRR strategies with the Sendai Framework.
- Common understanding of where capacity gaps lie.
- Understanding of the factors conducive to developing and implementing DRR strategies at all levels and means of support.

Methodology

The workshop will review the current DRR policy landscape in the region, explore how risk knowledge can be applied to DRR strategies, analyse the content and process of drafting DRR strategies, and lastly explore means to strengthen policy coherence with other global and national agendas. This will be done through:

- *Interactive discussion* through brainstorming sessions, participatory group work, and roundtables.
- Knowledge sharing through presentations on analysis outcomes, case-studies, guidelines/tools, and semi-structured discussions.
- *Knowledge co-generation* facilitated by self-assessments and experience learning cycles.
