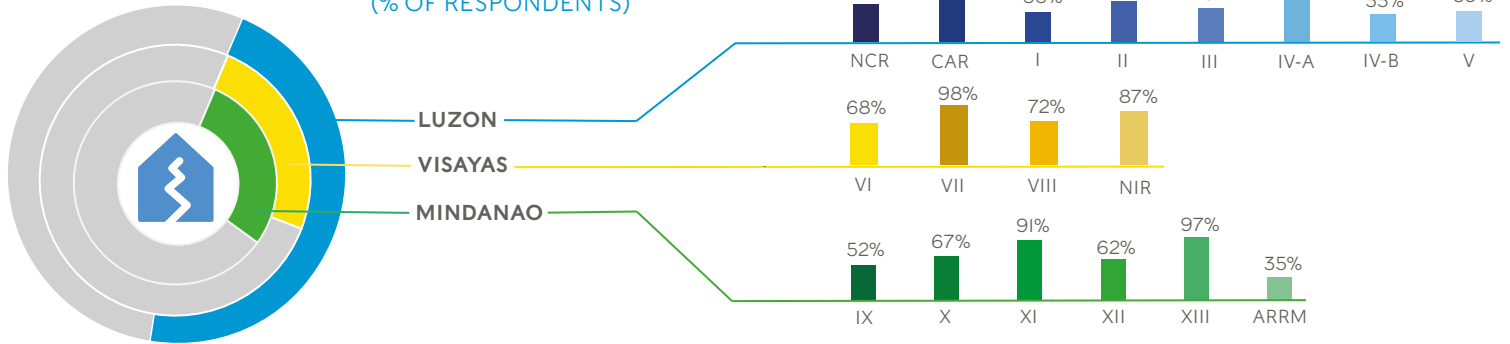


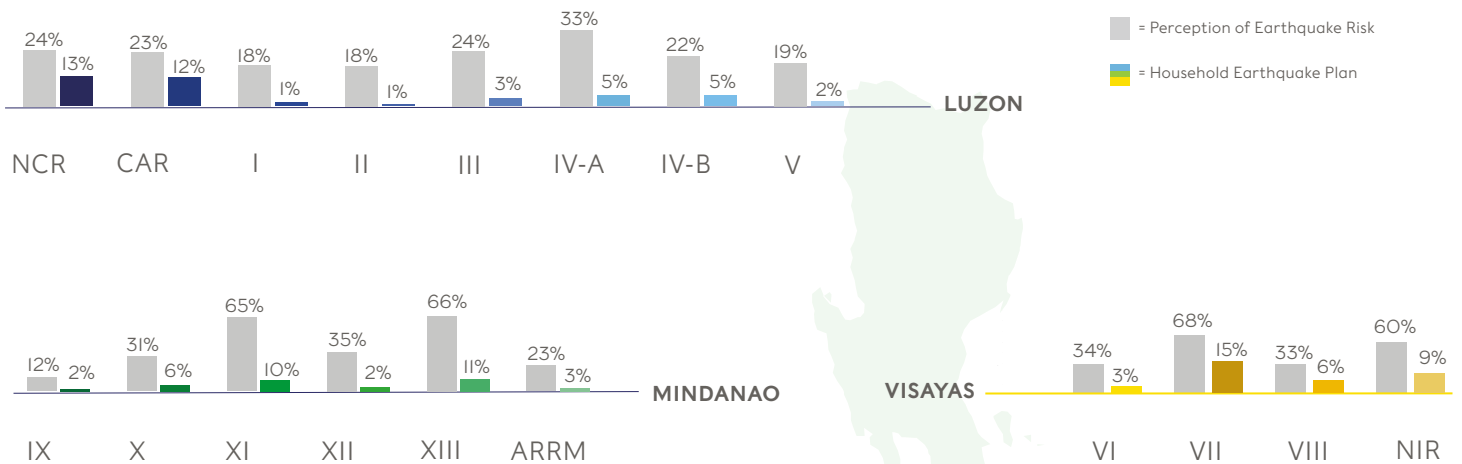
# EXPERIENCE & PERCEPTIONS ON EARTHQUAKE: THE PHILIPPINES

## EXPERIENCE OF AN EARTHQUAKE (% OF RESPONDENTS)



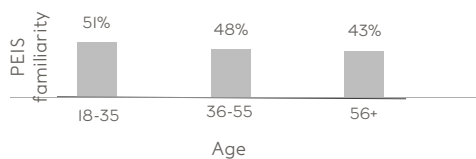

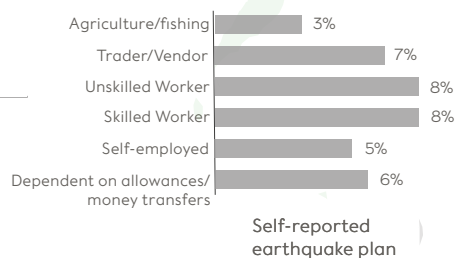
## FACTORS ASSOCIATED WITH HAVING A PLAN AND FAMILIARITY OF THE PHILVOCS EARTHQUAKE INTENSITY SCORE (PEIS) (% OF RESPONDENTS, SELF-RESPONDED)



Familiarity with the Earthquake Intensity Score (PEIS) was higher amongst younger respondents.



Households dependent on agriculture or fishing as their main livelihood are less likely to have an earthquake management plan.



More highly educated respondents and heads of household were more likely to report having a plan in the case of earthquakes.
