This side event will explore the significance of investing in resilient infrastructure to achieve climate and development goals.

This side event will provide an opportunity for the Government of India and UNDRR to provide an overview and objectives of the Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure (CDRI), which launches on 23 September. This new multicountry, multi-stakeholder Coalition aims to promote exchanges of knowledge and provide technical support to countries to implement disaster and climate resilient infrastructure.
