- Yet insufficient attention to people's needs, health outcomes and sectoral actions
- Health and health outcomes are:
  - A measure of impacts of disasters and effectiveness of actions
  - A bridge for effective DRR
  - Core of social justice
  - A pre-requisite for DRR towards sustainable development
