HYOGO FRAMEWORK

- **Ensure that Disaster Risk** Reduction (DRR) is a national and local priority with strong institutional basis for implementation
- 2. Identify, assess and monitoring risk and enhance early warning
- Use knowledge, innovation and education to build a culture of safety and resilience at all levels
- Reduce the underlying risk factors (reduce risk in key sectors)
- 5. Strengthen disaster preparedness for effective response at all levels
