# REGIONAL OVERVIEW

- SOLOMON IS: At least 200 schools were destroyed in 2007 tsunami with the two main hospitals on Gizo and Choiseul, as well as nearby health clinics, sustained heavy damage
- FIJI IS: 3 divisions affected by flooding Jan 2009
- PACIFIC is prone to disasters which directly affect school and health facilities and services

#### **EU FUNDED PROGRAM**

- □ EU/Fiji Education Sector Program (FESP)
- UN MDG, Declaration on Education for All & Convention on the Rights of the Child
- □ Project Life 2004-2009 a grant of \$F44 million
- □ Target:
  - □ Improvement of rural education
  - Improvement of disadvantaged schools in urban areas
  - Good quality education should be available to all the people in Fiji, irrespective of race, age, faith, etc

  Min. of Education & Min. of Health
- Availability of Funding Support & Technical Expertise
- Clear Timeframe with fluid Coordination and Networking – "Integrated Whole of Nation Approach"





#### RECOMMENDATIONS

- Develop retrofitting manual or guide for rural carpenters and builders
- Review existing national building codes based on multi hazard risk assessments
- Improve enforcement as well as promote benefits of compliance





#### RECOMMENDATIONS

- Integrate disaster risk and climate change issues into national educational systems
- Develop and test community preparedness and response plans, particularly for schools
- Collaborate advocacy activities in support of mainstreaming
