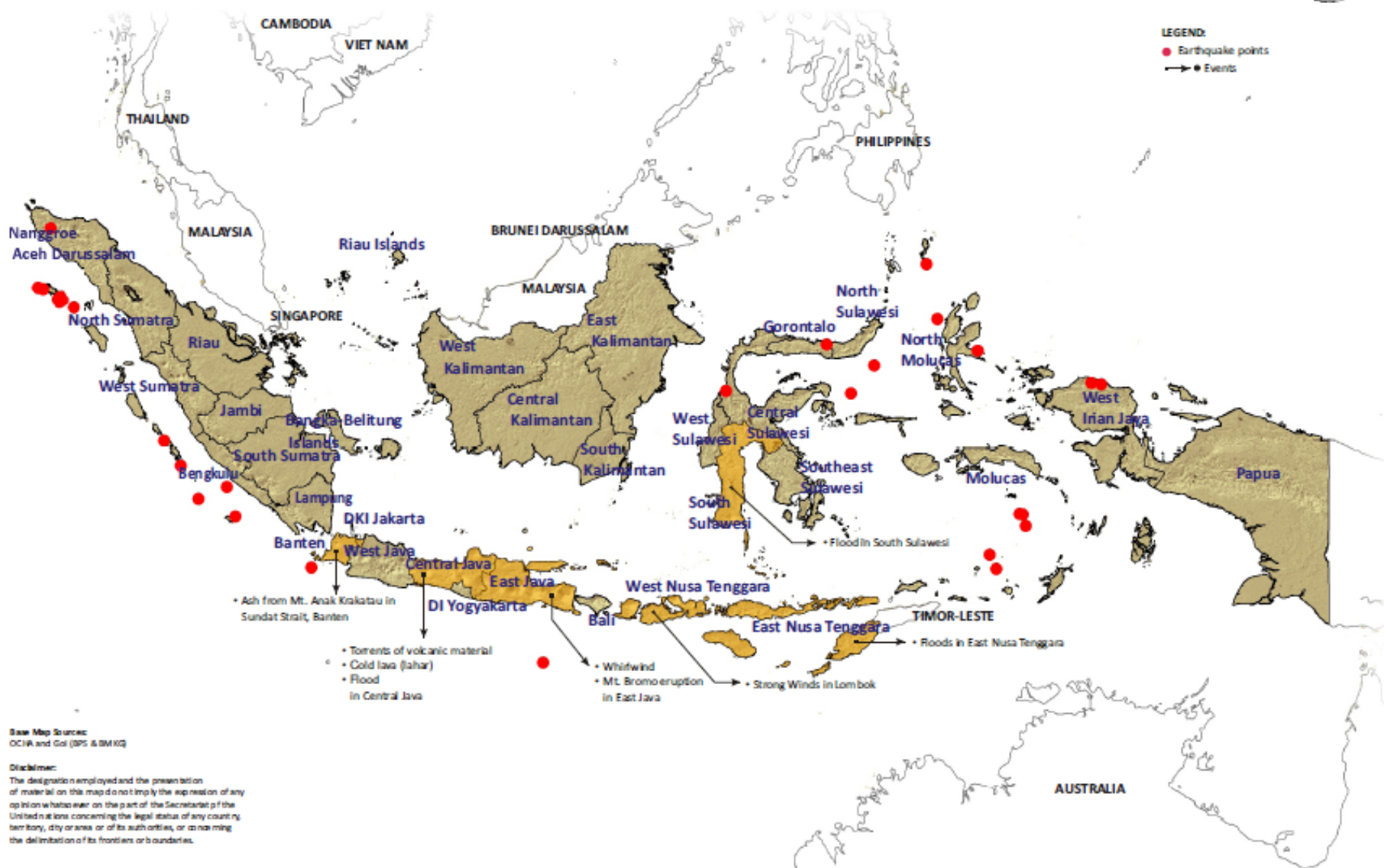

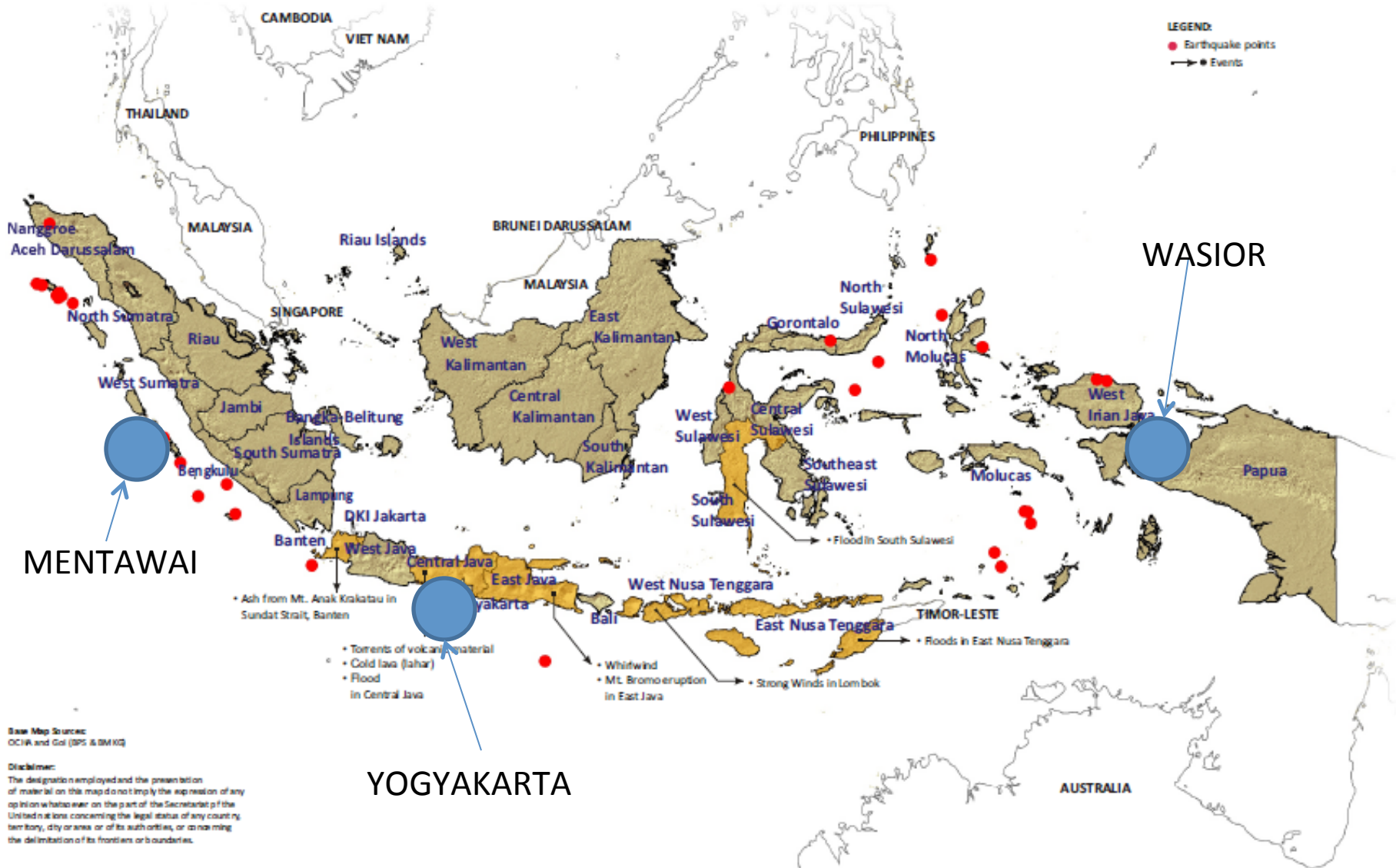

- Consist of 17.508 Islands → 6.000 are inhabited (1.919.440 KM2)
- Population 237, 6 million in 2010
- Morethen 300 Ethnic and dialect (local language)
- 5 Religion (Islam, Christian, Protestant, Hindu, Buddhist)
- Located in the edges of Pacific, Eurasia, Australian Tectonic Plates → the site of numerous volcano's & frequent earthquake → The world most disaster prone country
- 129 actives volcano's
- 644 natural disaster occurred in 2010 → 81.5% meteorological disaster (floods landslides & flash flood)
 - 3 big disaster in 2010 caused the most casualties & material lost
 - Flash Flood in Wasior - Papua
 - Earthquake/Tsunami in Mentawai - West Sumatera, and
 - Volcano Eruption Merapi - Yogyakarta
