




Registration as of 07 May 2011: 2966 participants

Delegates by org. type



European Commission	The European Commission will feature its integrated approach to disaster risk reduction, both within the Union and in other countries. The market stall will promote exchange on and the dissemination of knowhow, lessons learnt and best practices amongst the members of the disaster risk reduction community.
France	The stall will provide an overview of French institutions' and NGOs' activities on disaster risk reduction. The focus is on cultural and natural heritage and risk, risk and land-use planning, measures for structural vulnerability reduction, risk information and education, and international cooperation for reconstruction and recovery.
Germany	The market stall will provide an overview of Germany's best practice in disaster risk reduction in policy-making, development, science and the business sectors. Special focus will be on links made between disaster risk reduction and climate change adaptation, economic profiles disaster risk reduction and education.
Hungary	The market stall will highlight some of the most interesting aspects of the emergency and recovery intervention following the red sludge disaster that recently affected three counties in Hungary.
