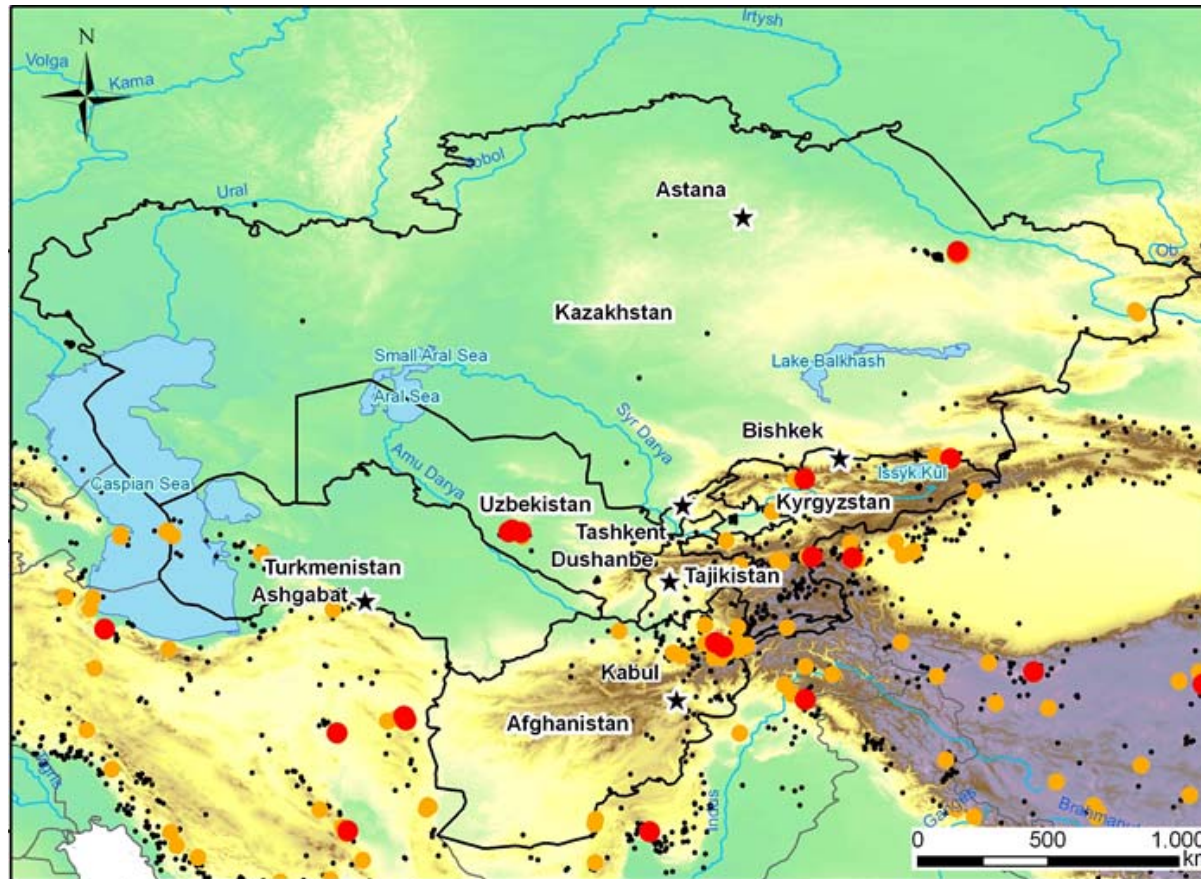
Central Asia is strongly affected by natural hazards.

Hazards often hit vulnerable communities.

An additional threat for the population in border regions (e.g. Fergana Valley) is the poor regional cooperation for crossborder risk reduction and emergency aid.

Project Objective:

The cooperation among the authorities for emergency situations in Central Asia (Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan) is improved and disaster-prone communities in border areas in Fergana Valley have strengthened their livelihoods and reduced their disaster vulnerability

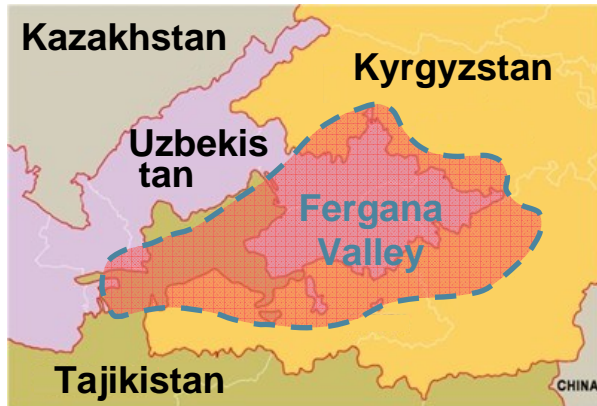

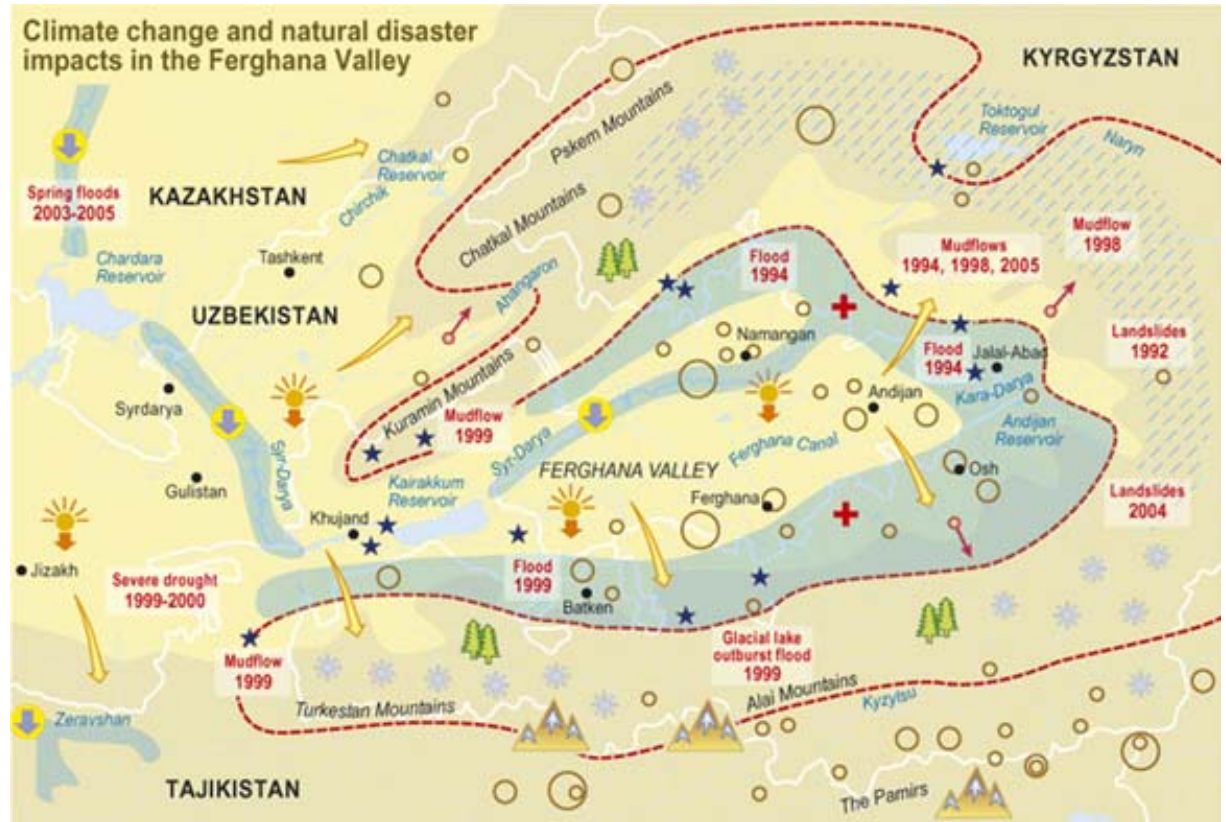

Project Region: Fergana Valley

Fergana Valley is the region most affected by the negative consequences of impermeable state borders





The Project is intervening on 3 levels:

regional

“conditions for cross-border disaster response in Central Asia improved”

national

“capacities of national authorities for disaster preparedness and response strengthened”

local

“in disaster-prone villages in Fergana Valley vulnerability to disasters is reduced and livelihoods are strengthened”
