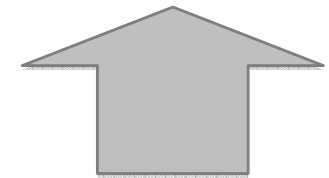
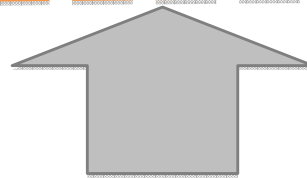
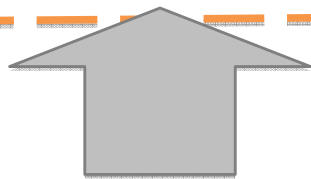
Sub/ regional HFA review process

National HFA progress review process

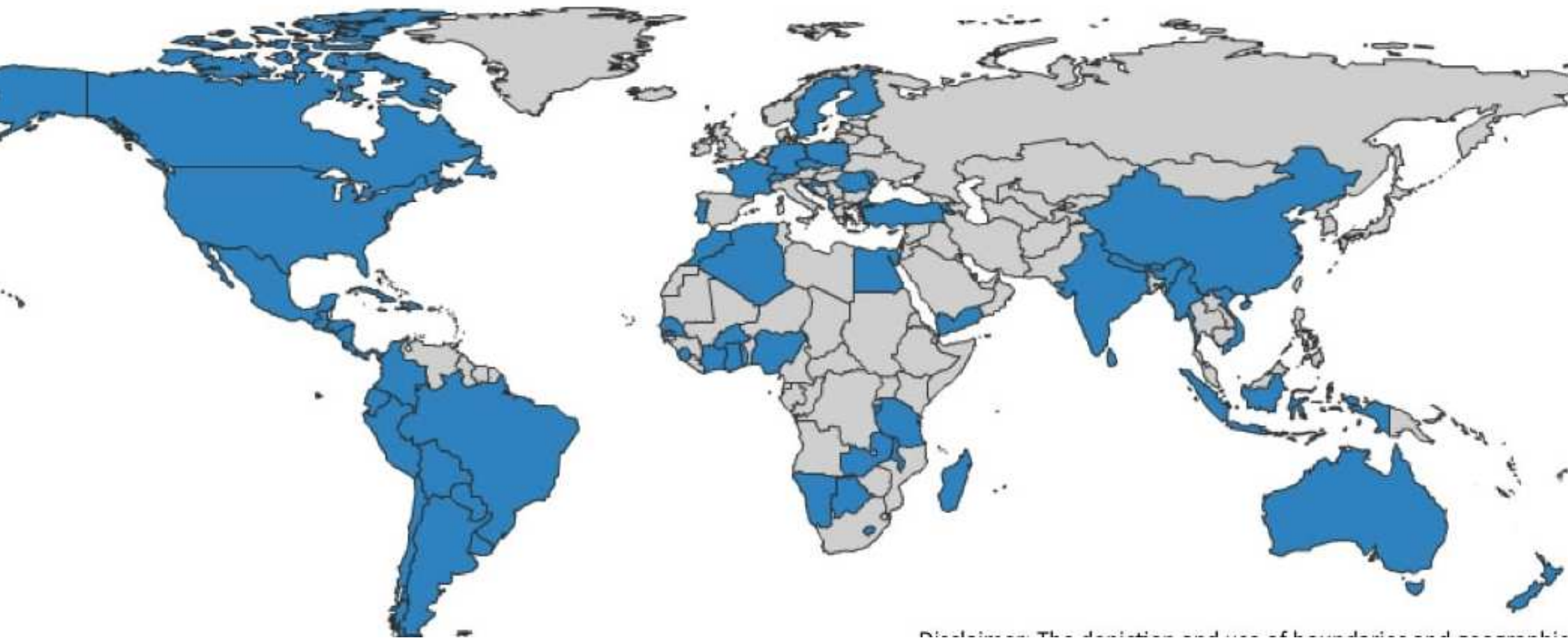

Local/ City HFA Review: The third tie

Initiate a multi stakeholder dialogue

A self assessment process for city/ local governments and local civil society organizations

Aimed at providing a feedback mechanism for the local and city governments

Intends to support the national Hyogo Framework for Action (HFA) review process

Local/ city Indicators

Prepared in consultation with local government representatives, civil society network and partners

Derived from the 'HFA Indicators of Progress

To assist city and local authorities in assessing their efforts in disaster risk reduction

Examples

Are **financial services** (e.g. saving and credit schemes, macro and micro-insurance) available to vulnerable and marginalised households for pre- and/or post-disaster times

Does the local government have access to adequate **financial resources** to carry out risk reduction activities in your city/municipality?

Has the city / municipality conducted thorough disaster **risk assessments** for various development sectors in your city/municipality?

Does the local government have emergency plans in place to deal with possible **mass casualty** needs?
