Rapid Emergency Assessment and Coordination Team – REACT

REACT – Rapid Emergency Assessment and Coordination Team, established in 2001, led by OCHA initially to coordinate disaster response.

Currently is chaired by CoES and UN Resident Coordinator in Tajikistan focused not only on response, but on prevention and preparedness, risk reduction as well as overall coordination of DRM sector.

Around 40 member organizations meet regularly to coordinate and share experiences in various DRM areas.

Membership:

- Government (MoES, other ministries & agencies)
- Donor organizations
- UN agencies
- International organizations & INGOs
- Red Cross/Red Crescent
- Local NGOs

REACT is a strong and effective partnership and coordination mechanism between the government and the international community dealing with disaster management in Tajikistan.

Sectoral Groups

Five Sectoral groups formed to address specific areas of Disaster Risk Management:

1. Non-Food Items and Shelter - **IFRC**
2. Food Aid - **UNWFP**
3. Health - **UNWHO**
4. Education - **UNICEF**
5. Water and Sanitation – **UNICEF**

Each group consists of organisations, working in respective sectors, and is headed by UN agency.

CoES is represented in each group by CoES Focal Points.

Disaster Management in Tajikistan

The Disaster Management Partnership in Tajikistan – Rapid Emergency Assessment and Coordination Team (REACT) was established in 2001 to promote the sharing of information, logistics and other resources between partners active in the disaster management sector, including the Committee of Emergency Situations and the Government of Tajikistan. The group that involves over 50 state, local and international organizations and entities meets regularly to coordinate and share experiences on issues related to various areas of disaster management, including preparedness, response, mitigation and capacity building activities with national bodies. Rapid Emergency Assessment and Coordination Team – REACT

Rapid Response Team (RRT)

Team of trained employees from different organizations – REACT partners, relevantly equipped and ready to be deployed jointly with the CoES staff members to the disaster site for rapid damage and needs assessment. All the REACT sectors are represented within RRT.





Rapid Emergency Assessment and Coordination Team – REACT

UN Emergency Reserve for Tajikistan (UNERT)

- UNERT is designed for the Initial response to a disaster or other humanitarian crisis creating resulting in needs in the areas of shelter, household items, sanitation items, clothing and heating/cooking equipment during winter conditions.
- These stocks are intended to alleviate human suffering and facilitate recovery from disasters, humanitarian crisis and refugee situations affecting Tajikistan.
- Stocks within UNERT can cover the needs of 7000 people, or 1000 households;
- The contribution of items to the emergency reserve can be provided in kind, through purchases, or through funds provided to UNDP.
