During the latter event, flash flooding in the Ivano-Frankivsk oblast led to 24 casualties, 9,370 evacuees, 28,000 damaged houses, 23,000 hectares of affected agricultural lands, 1,160 kilometers of ruined roads and 500 impaired bridges.
