Location (short description)	The municipality includes the main town and two peripheral districts: Scario (small cluster of homes and villas around the harbor and shore of the Policastro gulf) and the Wood, up the hill. All of them are located just under the dolomitic Mount Bugheria (1225 mt), in the area of Campania bordering Basilicata, south of Naples and Salerno, facing the south Tirreanean sea.

Hydro-geological risk: river flow in the area is seasonal: densely populated areas near creeks and rivers are subject to flooding in case of abundant or torrential rain. Particularly exposed are the Barbarola area in the Scario district, where the Saint Lucia creek runs, and the Bussento District where the Isca creek enters the Bussento river. Most sensitive to hydro-geological risk is the Scario district where the River Basin local authorities identify 5 sites of highest (4) and high (3) risk. San Giovanni a Piro itself includes two areas of highest and high risk. The Bosco (the Woods) district has one. In all of the identified areas landslides have occurred in recent past, therefore the land slide motion should be considered as active.

Seismic risk is average or low. After the main 1980 seismic event others have occurred without consequences.

Sea storms afflict the Scario district because of proximity of homes to the shoreline and harbor. Particularly violent storm in November 2010 caused extensive damage to roads infrastructure and some civil housing, whose inhabitants had to be evacuated.

Industrial activity hazards: one company in the municipal district builds fire-works. The industrial site covers 20 thousand square meters. A circular area of 73 Mt radius around it constitutes a buffer and is not inhabited. The following area for a radius of 466 Mt includes roads, two buildings and one industrial site whee an accident could involve two people. Around it, for 1200 Mt. many buildings and industrial activities could suffer some damage in case of accident and involve up to 450 people in summer/vacation time.

Wild fire is particularly dangerous in areas of touristic value and receptivity.
