Policy & Legislation

- Sets out (a) the legal rights of citizens and (b) the duties of the state towards them
- To be effective they require regulatory frameworks/ mechanisms

Policy & Legislative Systems

...are key elements of building sustainable institution for DRR...

 Financial & political commitment essential for effective implementation



Mainstreaming

 Policy and legislation are key entry points to engage line ministries.

 When linked with financial mechanisms can serve as <u>incentives</u> for sectors to get involved in DRR.



Local perspective in national frameworks

 Crucial to engage effectively with local level in both formulation & implementation

 Strengthened systems and local level are end result

Outstanding issues and challenges:
