



Legislative and administrative acts supporting implementation of Hyogo Framework for Action in Republic of Tajikistan

- Law on Fund for mitigation of emergency situations, 1993 (financing of rehabilitation works)
- Law on Civil Defense, 1995 (revised in 2004)
- Law on Fire Safety, 1994
- Law on Radiation Safety, 2000
- Law on protection of population from natural and manmade (technological) emergencies, 2004

- Formation of Committee for Emergency Situations and Civil Defense, 1994
- Measures for rehabilitation, development, and improvement of systems of communications and early warning in civil defense of RT, 2002

Institutional base for identifying, assessing and monitoring disaster risks and early warning in Tajikistan

- Agency for Hydro-meteorology, Hydro-meliorative expedition
- State control of use of resources and protection of nature
- System of Monitoring and Early Warning (Lake Sarez Risk Mitigation Project, 2004) in the Bartang Valley and on Lake Sarez
- Center for Information Management and Analytical Centre at CoES RT created by resolution of Government, with support from Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC) and UN Disaster Risk Management Project (UDRMP) in 2005

Collaboration and cooperation between Government of RT and international organizations

- > Support to Training Center of CoES by UNDRMP and SDC
- Creation of commission for revision and improvement of training programs in management of natural disasters for executive officials in the central and local government, structures of CoES, economic entities, population
- Consideration of including disaster preparedness disciplines in the formal education curricula at university and school levels
- CoES and international organizations with funding from DIPECHO collaborate in implementation of 30 projects in disaster risk reduction and disaster preparedness

Partnerships

The Rapid Emergency Assessment and Coordination Team (REACT) was formed in 2001

REACT comprises over 60 key national and international governmental and non-governmental organizations, for rapid assessment and effective response to disasters

REACT developed an inter-agency plan for preparedness and Response.












The scheme of early warning system at Lake Sarez



In the end of 2004, the system was handed over to the Committee for Emergencies and Civil Defense. In April 2006 the State Commission for acceptance of the system, comprising representatives of the Government, the World Bank, and implementers, fully approved the results of testing. As part of disaster preparedness, FOCUS Humanitarian Assistance in collaboration with Committee of ES and CD provided training in disaster preparedness of population in five districts of Tajikistan. The project and the partners resolved many social problems linked to Lake Sarez safety.



Although many problems of safety of Lake Sarez were resolved, the threat remains for large densely populated areas of Tajikistan, Uzbekistan, Afghanistan, and Turkmenistan
